Nessij X Moussem

The Nessij X Moussem residency program offers research residencies of two months, in Brussels, Belgium. The program aims to strengthen ties between the Tunisian and Brussels art scenes, with particular attention to diasporic communities from the African and Asian continents.

Through these residencies, Nessij and Moussem seek to foster artistic exchange, dialogue, and reflection around socially, communally, and politically engaged practices. The residency offers artists the space to deepen their research, connect with local artistic networks, and engage with the vibrant multicultural landscape of Brussels.

For the residency, the artist will receive:

- Accommodation in Brussels
- Access to a workspace
- Per diem of 25 EUR/day
- Research and production grant of 500 EUR
- 50 EUR allowance for exhibition and/or performance visits in Belgium

Eligibility

Residencies are by invitation, based on ongoing conversations between Moussem and Nessij around artistic practices with strong social, communal, or political engagement.

About Nessij

Nessij, which means “web” in Arabic, is a collective founded in 2023 by a group of Tunisian artists and art workers who aim to support and promote the Tunisian artistic and cultural scene internationally. Nessij aims to encourage the circulation of artists, their works and the country's cultural workers, as well as to strengthen exchange and solidarity between scenes, and particularly within the South.

About Moussem

Moussem is an international arts center based in Brussels, dedicated to the development, production, and presentation of visual and performing arts. Through a strong residency program and long-term collaborations with local and international institutions, Moussem supports the structural growth of artists and their practices. Deeply committed to the interculturalization of the arts in Flanders and Brussels, Moussem actively engages with political and social questions of representation, migration, and identity, fostering dialogue with a diverse, urban audience.
